Topic: The Art of Pennsylvania Woods in a Gallery and in Penn's Woods

Schedule: This is a two-part program

10:00: The program begins at the World West Galleries. Gallery owners and artists Robin and Peter West will discuss artists and woodland paintings of Southwest Pennsylvania.

11:30: Break to travel to the Perkey Tree Farm. Plan to bring your own bag lunch or stop for a fast food meal along the way.

1:00 Arlyn Perkey has been capturing memories of his tree farm for over 30 years. During this portion of the program, he will be showing "Then and Now" photos to illustrate changes in the woodland resulting from his forest management practices. In addition, he will share tips on

capturing special "moments in time and place" that build human connection to the land, the cornerstone to stewardship.
